## Scoring your FCLE Practice Test: "What should I study?"

A quick guide to grading your Practice FCLE to determine your study focus from Florida State College at Jacksonville (FSCJ).

- Start by the practice test found on the Florida Department of Education website (<a href="https://www.fldoe.org/accountability/assessments/k-12-student-assessment/fcle.stml">https://www.fldoe.org/accountability/assessments/k-12-student-assessment/fcle.stml</a>) and writing down your answers for each question.
- After you do this, mark the questions you got incorrect. Then, using the table below, mark the incorrect questions on the table. Then, add the number of questions you got correct and put it above the total number of questions (provided in the chart).
- Next, calculate these scores as percentages and study most for the section with the lowest percentage.
- However, it is important to note that prioritizing the study of the Constitution is beneficial because having a firm understanding of the Constitution greatly informs knowledge of the other competencies.
- When studying, search for resources based on your weakest competency. Master your weakest competency before focusing on another competency. Don't miss the forest for the trees!
- Remember: you do not need to know every small detail. Rather, recognize big themes in American Civics and focus on the most decisive documents, laws, or events as they pertain to the competencies.
